A *Family Compact* is an agreement that families, students, and teachers develop together. It explains how families and teachers will work together to make sure all students reach or exceed grade level standards.

Effective compacts:

- Link to goals of the school improvement plan
- Focus on student learning skills
- Describe how teachers will help students develop those skills using high-quality instruction
- Share strategies families can use at home
- Explain how teachers and families will communicate about student progress

- Communicate with the school about changes in home life, absences, homework, and any other issues/concerns
- Participate in school opportunities, such as family nights, in-class crafts, and extra-curricular activities
- Join family groups, such as PTO, LSIC, & Title I Advisory Group
- Check your child's academic progress through LiveGrades (if a computer is accessible)

At Home

Leon Elementary School families joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math.

Some of our key at-home activities will be:

- Try to attend family meetings and join our PTO.
- Share ideas for school improvement by attending LSIC meetings.
- Read with your child every week.
- Practice math fluency facts regularly.
